A programme aimed at students from all faculties on campus to help them reconcile the development of their artistic training with their academic responsibilities.

THEATRE TRAINING PLAN

Directed by Liuba Cid. 95 students participated. The Theatre Training Plan, the Fifth University Theatre Showcase was held at the Museum with 694 people attending; and the Theatre Fortnight, held at Civivox Iturrama, attracted nearly 2,000 people.

CREATIVE HUB

Eight people participated in this initiative with students from several campus centres using creativity and innovation methodologies.



FIFTH EDITION OF LA VOZ DE TU FACULTAD (THE VOICE OF YOUR FACULTY)

74 students participated and there were 15 finalists. The winner was Florencia Musmarra, a student in the Executive Master's Degree Programme in Corporate Reputation and a representative of the Madrid Campus. Second place went to Martina Durán, a candidate in the Faculty of Pharmacy and Nutrition. and the third place winner was Sofía Faulín from the ISSA School of Applied Management. The grand final held at the Theatre was attended by 470 people.

SECOND LEAD CREATIVE CONFERENCE

On 25-27 March, this international conference was held to address the development of leadership through creativity to deal with today's professional and social challenges.

Promoted by 48 students from six faculties. 1,257 face-to-face and online participants. Speakers included representatives from Universidad Panamericana (Mexico), Universidad Hemisferios (Ecuador), Universidad de Monterrey (Mexico), Universidad de Piura (Peru), Universidad de los Andes (Colombia), Strathmore University (Kenya), Pan-Atlantic University (Nigeria), and the University of Asia and the Pacific (Philippines).

140 students from the Symphony Orchestra, the Choir and the Theatre Training Plan, scenography students from the School of Design and staging students in the Performing Arts Production Plan of the Faculty of Communication took part in La Zarzuela de los Paraguas [Zarzuela of the Umbrellas], a collaboration project with Liuba Cid in charge of stage management and Borja Quintas in charge of musical direction. The exhibition proposal Función y ficción (Function and Fiction) by graduates Celeste Garduño Carbajal and Santiago Ávila Albuja, won the competition organized by the Museum in collaboration with the Colección Bergé and the Madrid law firm Cuatrecasas. The project was selected from among those presented by students in the fourth graduating class and was inaugurated on 22 September 2022 in the entrance area of the Cuatrecasas headquarters in Madrid.

ARTE Y ESPACIO IV

The Universidad de Navarra School of Architecture hosted the fourth edition of the Arte y Espacio (Art and Space) exhibition produced by students in the master's degree programme and directed by Professor Javier Antón. The exhibition provided insight into the role of space and its visual aspects in the narrative of exhibitions. Each team chose a topic for in-depth analysis. This time, the concepts selected were craft and design, synaesthesia, bodily empathy and the sensory.

IN THE ARTIST'S SHOES

To finish the subject The Curator and the Artist, the students set aside the role of curator to put on the shoes of the artist under the guidance of artist Daniel Canogar [Madrid, 1964]. Over the course of four days, the students took on the role of creator and devised their own proposals in small groups, which they then discussed together with the rest of the class.

COLLABORATIONS WITH UNIVERSITY FACULTIES AND CENTRES



During the academic year, the Museum collaborated with the professors of curricular subjects in undergraduate and master's degree programmes in 11 faculties and centres on campus: Faculties of Architecture, Medicine, Nursing, Science, Communication, Education and Psychology, Economics, and Pharmacy and Nutrition, and the Institute of Spanish Language and Culture (ILCE). 867 students attended classes taught by Museum staff and 1.400 attended classes in the Museum's curricular programme taught in classrooms and other spaces, thus making the Museum a learning space. In addition, 1,277 prospective students learned about the Museum project and participated in a visual thinking activity through the Admissions Service.

For the second year, the educational area of the Museum participated with the Faculty of Education and Psychology on the research project on key factors of the significant experience with the work of art in children and young people who visit museums or art centres.

ART AND PALLIATIVE CARE

38 students in the first to the sixth years of Medicine took the subject End-of-Life Decision-Making taught in the Museum's exhibition rooms. Using visual thinking and objectbased learning methodologies, they explored the use of art in palliative care.

SEMINAR WITH ARTIST ILA BÊKA

Students from the School of Architecture participated in the International Seminar on Visual Cultures held at the museum by artist Ila Bêka, one half of the film duo Ila Bêka and Louise Lemoine, with French film maker Lucas Bacle. Seminar participants explored the building using their five senses. The result, captured on video, was presented at the Museum and the School of Architecture.

at these meetings by sharing their work on Elektra.25 and El animal de Hungría.

CONFLUENCIAS (CONFLUENCES)

Curated by Raquel Cascales, the cycle brings together professors from the Universidad de Navarra and professionals from different disciplines to discuss a range of topics with the audience. The fourth edition was on image and reality, and used Cristina de Middel's exhibition as its starting point. The fifth edition focused on the continuities and differences between nature and culture, and was organized based on Álvaro Laiz's exhibition.

The cycle aims to explore the exhibitions in depth in relation to different topics with the help of artists and experts in different disciplines. The Museum's film programme was reinvented with PLANO/ CONTRAPLANO (SHOT/REVERSE SHOT), a proposal that generates dialogue and expands on the topics, methods and questions raised by the public in each season's artistic programme. Coordinated by María Noguera, a professor of film in the Faculty of Communication, it takes its name from a traditional way of filming: first using the camera to film one character and then moving the camera to film the other character's response. This proposal aims to replicate this movement: the shot is the Museum programme and the reverse shot consists of other ways of creating a dialogue with the exhibitions and staged performances.




